Dear Brothers and Sisters of Saint John the Baptist Parish Family Dear Friends of our Parish,

As we gather today to celebrate the 29 th Sunday in Ordinary time, several weeks into the school year 2024-2025, I would like to highlight - once again - the importance of children and young people in the life and ministry of our Parish. In addition, I would like to reassure all of you that our community's ministry and outreach to ALL our "young parishioners" and their families continue to be among our most significant pastoral and human priorities. Jesus himself during his public ministry some two thousand years ago - and day by day since then in the history of the Church and of the entire humanity - has unambiguously underscored the irreplaceable role of children and young people in our human and spiritual lives.

In the passage from the 9 th chapter of Mark's Gospel he told us that "Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the One who sent me" (Mark 9:37). In the same chapter of the Gospel Jesus sternly warned us to be always mindful of any harm we could cause in the lives of children and young people either through our bad example or sinful actions: "Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck and he were thrown into the sea" (Mark 9:42). And, in the following chapter of Mark's Gospel our Savior goes even one step further. He is challenging us to examine some of our own ways of "adult" living, our language, actions and attitudes, and be inspired by the love, trust, faith and simplicity of children: "Let the children come to me; do not prevent them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Amen, I say to you, whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it" (Mark 10:14-15).

May our loving Mother, whom we honor during the month of October as Our Lady of the Rosary, Saint Joseph her protector and most chaste spouse, and our heavenly patron, Saint John the Baptist, continue to accompany us and intercede for us. Let's pray for God's guidance and inspiration so that our Parish may always serve and minister to our children, young people, and their families, with dedication, concern, and zeal. Let's continue to invite them to join us for our Sunday liturgies and on the spiritual journey of our community, with Jesus, our Friend and Redeemer. We ALL need THEM, and THEY ALL need the Parish of Saint John the Baptist.

The Solemnity of Our Lady of the Rosary, annually celebrated on October 7, commemorates a victorious naval battle fought in Lepanto, off the western coast of Greece, on October 7th in 1571 between the Catholic Holy League, and the Turkish forces which had, ultimately, threatened the future of the Christian faith in Europe. As the Christian civilization was under threat during that time, the Dominican pope at the time, Saint Pius V, led processions in Rome, and asked the Christian people to pray the Rosary, that beautiful and distinctive Dominican prayer.

Praying together we confirm that the Holy Rosary is not a pious practice banished to the past, like prayers of other times thought of with nostalgia. Instead, the Rosary is experiencing a new Springtime. Without a doubt, this is one of the most eloquent signs of love that the young generation nourish for Jesus and his Mother, Mary. In the current world, so dispersive, this prayer helps to put Christ at the center, as the Virgin did, who meditated within all that was said about her Son, and also what he did and said. When reciting the Rosary, the important and meaningful moments of salvation history are relived. The various steps of Christ's mission are traced. With Mary the heart is oriented toward the mystery of Jesus. Christ is put at the center of our life, of our time, of our city, through the contemplation and meditation of his holy mysteries of joy, light, sorrow and glory. May Mary help us to welcome within ourselves the grace emanating from these mysteries, so that through us we can "water" society, beginning with our daily relationships, and purifying them from so many negative forces, thus opening them to the newness of God. The Rosary, when it is prayed in an authentic way, not mechanical and superficial but profoundly, it brings, in fact, peace and reconciliation. It contains within itself the healing power of the Most Holy Name of Jesus, invoked with faith and love at the center of each "Hail Mary".
