Dear Brothers and Sisters of Saint John the Baptist Parish Family Dear Friends of our Parish,

Scott's talks have inspired countless people throughout the world to a deeper desire to grow and "walk" toward better, more prosperous and more harmonious tomorrows. And while Scott's message of human and personal resilience and growth has been embraced and lauded by all different audiences of our modern world, the spiritual dimension of that life journey and the fact that our loving and eternal God always lifts us up through the challenges of life, will be the Lenten message of faith, hope and joy which Scott will share with us. I hope that you can all join us. Scott's presence among us, as well as his heartfelt personal witness is certainly also for each and every one of us a wonderful opportunity to invite our family members, friends, neighbors, classmates, colleagues, teammates or business associates to our Saint John the Baptist Church and allow them to experience the great spirit of the love of God, community, human concern, and spiritual growth which we all share in this "Spiritual Home" of ours. 
